Aiming to seal series, India need young bowlers to deliver

RAIPUR, NOV 30: India's young bowling unit, which has been under the pump, will look to better its debut-ovary performance while awaiting Glenn Maxwell's absence to its advantage in the fourth T20 international against Australia here on Friday.

India's second string attack did not play a part in the first two games in the third match which the Australians won while chasing a daunting 223-run target.

There is a possibility of a minor tweak in the Indian line-up after Prashant Kishan gave away 89 runs in four overs, including 21 in the final over.

Deeptak Chahar is back in the T20 mix and his ability to move the new ball should be considered for his inclusion in the playing XI along with death overs specialist Mukesh Kumar who is back after one-match break.

Both Prachin and Avish Khan lack variety and innovation as they keep pitching the ball at the same length. Both bowl in late 130s or early 140s but consistently pitch it back of the length and the nature of Indian tracks make it a cannon fodder for batsmen.

Also not being able to use variations like conventional or wide yorkers has been the downfall of these bowlers who also don't exhibit slower deliveries properly.

In the batting line up, Shreyas Iyer's comeback means only Rahul Varma looks a candidate who could be bench as the others - Yashvi Jaiswal, Ruturaj Gaikwad, Ishan Kishan, support Suryakumar Yadav and feather Rinku Singh select themselves. India will also look to exploit the absence of a marauding Maxwell who pulled off a host of shots to ungloriously bring Australia back into the five-match series with a win in a tight contest in Guwahati.

But the hosts will fancy their chances with Maxwell and other influential players such as Steve Smith and Adam Zampa not figuring in the playing XI here, having left for home after a long stay in the country where they won their

The likes of Jason Behrendorf, Kane Richardson and Nathan Aspinall could find the going tough on most days. So far, the unenviable conditions meant the series has been a nightmare for the bowlers with the 200-plus totals in six ODI, and the band is expected to continue in the remainder of the

Instead, they will probably be bowling to players such as Tim David, Josh Philippe and big hitter Ben McDermott, a far better proposition at the moment than challenging Maxwell, who has enhanced his reputation as one of Australia's greatest white-ball batsmen in the past five six weeks.

The venue, and the manner and situation in which he has accumulated them, has catapulted Maxwell into a level not meant for him. India's bowlers, though, will still have to contend with Travis Head, on a high after his scintillating match-winning hundred in the World Cup final against India, and the Australian

Panghal, Thapa sail into National Boxing semifinals

SHILLONG, NOV 30: World Championships runner-up Amit Panghal (54kg) and 2021 Asian Champion Sanjeet (69kg) continued their impressive run as 12 SSCB boxers secured semifinal spots at the Men's National Boxing Championships here on Thursday.

Five-time Asian Championships medalist Shiva Thapa, representing Assam, also progressed to the last-four stage.

Panghal dominated the proceedings throughout and ultimately won the bout convincingly in an unanimous decision against Maharashtra's Anil of Jamnoli and Kashmeri.

He will next face Anil of RSPB in the semifinals. Up against 2016 Commonwealth Games bronze medalist Naman Tarkar of RSPB, Sanjeet was at the top of his game as he controlled the bout and played him at a distance.

The referee stopping the contest here will fight it out against Vishal Kumar of Delhi.

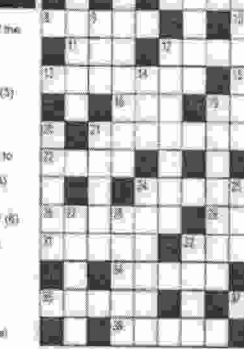

Eight junior boxers enter semifinals at Junior World C'ships, assure medals

NEW DELHI, NOV 30: Eight junior boxers secured a medal after progressing to the semifinals on day six of the 194 Junior World Boxing Championships 2023 in Yerevan, Armenia on Thursday.

Extending their pre-tournament run at the tournament, six out of the seven junior girls made their way into the semifinals.

The two gold medalists from the Asian junior boxing championships - Poo (50kg) and Ni, (68kg) - won their quarterfinal bouts with identical unanimous 5-0 wins against Kazakhstan's Seibakzhanalyzhan and Kuo Chua A of Chinese Taipei respectively.

Poo (48kg) scored a comfortable 5-0 win over Doherty Lavinia of Ireland while Amalia (45kg), outperformed Kim Jina of South Korea for a unanimous 5-0 win over the host nation.

The Asian junior silver medalist Neha Lunthi (48kg) was tested by Hizouskays Anhelina of Belarus before she emerged victorious with a 4-1 split decision win.
